

# <u>COMMENCEMENT OF WORKS – HONEYSUCKLE PARK CONSTR</u>UCTION

#### 23 October 2020

The urban renewal of Honeysuckle is a signature project for Hunter and Central Coast Development Corporation (HCCDC). Honeysuckle is changing, with new open space areas alongside residential, commercial and entertainment precincts.

Honeysuckle Park will mark a significant step in the delivery of a new public domain and the continued revitalisation of the Honeysuckle waterfront. It is a step towards completing the magnificent 11km stretch of community pathways and connections from Throsby Creek to Bathers Way. The construction of Honeysuckle Park is one of HCCDC's key projects delivering a waterfront park in the city centre.

Glascott Landscape & Civil are excited to be working on behalf of HCCDC to deliver Honeysuckle Park.

### Work includes:

This work will involve:

- Demolition, Excavation and earthworks
- Vehicle movements including trucks, powered mobile plant, utility and delivery vehicles
- Construction of Sandstone seating steps along the Foreshore
- Playground equipment
- Picnic shelters, BBQ's, furniture and lighting
- Concrete and granite paving pathways
- Soft Landscaping including Irrigation

### When will work take place?

We will commence work on this project on 26 October 2020, we expect work to conclude on 1 June 2021.

In line with City of Newcastle guidelines, we expect people to be working on site from 7:00 to 18:00, Monday to Friday.



# What to expect during construction

There may be some noise and dust associated with this work. We apologise for the inconvenience and will aim to minimise the impact of our work by:

- Using suppression techniques to minimise dust e.g. watering
- Turning off equipment when not in use
- Not using equipment outside of work hours
- Using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery (including delivery vehicles)
- Reducing the gathering of staff on site before and after work

# **Traffic and Pedestrian Changes**

Rear access from the Lume Apartments to the Foreshore will be closed during the Construction period. Pedestrians may reach the Foreshore during the construction period via Worth Place.
