Work in your area – Temporary amenities installation at Honeysuckle Park

Hunter and Central Coast Development Corporation is committed to creating outstanding public spaces at Honeysuckle in Newcastle. This letter is to let you know we will soon be installing temporary public amenities at Honeysuckle Park, so visitors and residents alike can better enjoy this popular children's playground and picnic area.

The toilets will consist of two standalone accessible units, which will be serviced daily while in use. The units will be installed over two days early in the New Year.

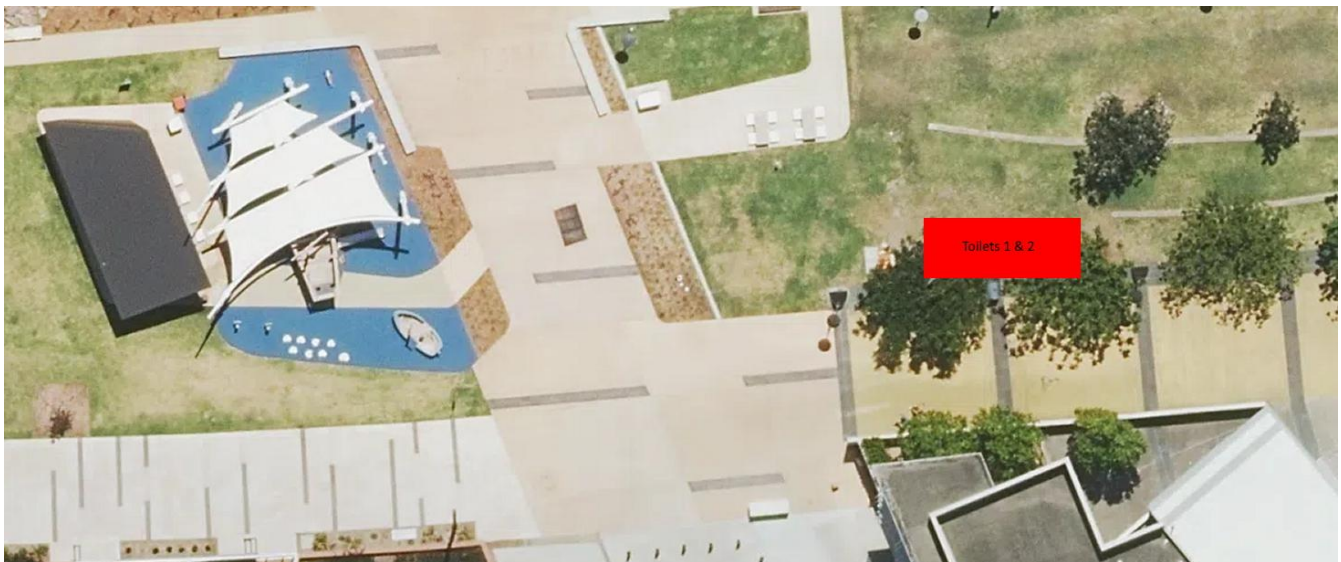


Figure 1 Location of temporary amenities

Why we're installing temporary toilets

Our maritime-themed Honeysuckle Park has been a hive of activity since opening in mid-2021. Park visitors told us they want access to public toilets, so we're installing the temporary amenities while we progress our plans to construct permanent facilities in collaboration with City of Newcastle.

How this may affect you

This work will be carried out during daylight hours and is not expected to be particularly disruptive. You may notice some additional activity on site and low-level noise while the units are installed. The park will remain open and pedestrian access will be maintained.
